BASIC REQUIREMENTS

- A GPA of 2.00 must be achieved within this area. A cumulative collegelevel GPA of 2.00 is also required.
- No Pass/Fail/S grades allowed (exception: AP, CLEP, DANTES, IB scores, and College in the High School (CHS)).

Group A: ENGL& 101 required. Choose five units from: ENGL 102, 203 Group B: Courses used to satisfy this requirement may not be used to satisfy Natural Sciences distribution. Choose five units from: MATH 111, 130, 220, 264, 274, MATH& 107, 132, 141, 142, 146, 148, 151, 152, 153, 254, 163, 264, PHIL& 120.

Group C: Courses used to satisfy this requirement may not be used to satisfy Humanities distribution. Choose 3-5 units from: CAS 106, CMST 140, 202, CMST& 101, 210, 220, 230.

HUMANITIES REQUIREMENTS

- May include a maximum of 5 units in performance, which is <u>underlined</u> on the Approved Distribution Courses (on reverse), and a maximum of 5 units of 100-level Foreign Languages or American Sign Language.
- Maximum of 5 units may be taken as "S" grades.
- Select courses from three disciplines (subject areas) from the Approved Distribution Courses list (on reverse).
- A GPA of 2.00 must be achieved within this area. A cumulative collegelevel GPA of 2.00 is also required.

NATURALSCIENCES/MATHREQUIREMENTS

- Must include one lab science course which is <u>underlined</u> on the Approved Distribution Courses (on reverse).
- Maximum of 5 units may be taken as "S" grades.
- A GPA of 2.00 must be achieved within this area. A cumulative collegelevel GPA of 2.00 is also required.

SOCIAL SCIENCES REQUIREMENTS

- Select courses from three disciplines (subject areas) from the Approved Distribution Courses (on reverse).
- Maximum of 5 units may be taken as "S" grades.
- A GPA of 2.00 must be achieved within this area. A cumulative collegelevel GPA of 2.00 is also required.

CORE ELECTIVES REQUIREMENTS

- Electives should be chosen carefully from the distribution of courses listed in Quantitative/Symbolic Reasoning (Group B above) and the Approved Distribution Courses (on reverse).
- A GPA of 2.00 must be achieved within this area. A cumulative collegelevel GPA of 2.00 is also required.

ELECTIVES REQUIREMENT

- Any college-level course numbered 100 or above. These may include additional Core Electives as well as courses from the Restricted List.
- No more than three PE activity units can apply toward the AA-DTA degree.
