



**Associate in Business Direct Transfer Agreement Degree (DTA/MRP) – BUCBUAA
Degree Worksheet – 90 Credits
2024-2025**

Direct transfer agreements (DTA) are statewide articulated transfer degree agreements between the community colleges and public baccalaureate universities. When admitted to a university, students will enter at junior standing. Admission to a university or its College or School of Business is NOT guaranteed to students holding a Business Transfer DTA/MRP degree. Some institutions have requirements for admission to the major that go beyond those required for admission to the university. It is highly recommended that students meet with an academic advisor on a regular basis to be sure that requirements specified in the degree are met. Students should also seek academic advising from the university to which they plan to transfer to learn about additional requirements, procedures for admission, and GPA requirements.

BASIC REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum 2.00 GPA required in each group.
- No Pass/Fail "S" grades allowed. (Exception: AP, CLEP, DANTES, IB scores, and College in the High School (CHS)).
- ENGL& 101 and ENGL 102 are required.
- MATH 111 required with a grade of "C" or better.

HUMANITIES

- Minimum 2.00 GPA required in each group.
- No Pass/Fail "S" grades allowed.
- May include a maximum of five credits in skill performance courses which are underlined in the approved distribution list and a maximum of five credits of 100 level foreign languages OR 100 level American Sign Language. See Note 3 for speech recommendation.
- Select courses from THREE disciplines (subject areas) from the respective list of approved Humanities distribution courses.

NATURAL SCIENCES/MATH

- Minimum 2.00 GPA required in each group.
- No Pass/Fail "S" grades allowed.
- Must include one lab science course which is underlined in the approved distribution list.
- Must include MATH& 148
- Select courses from THREE disciplines (subject areas) from the respective list of approved Natural Sciences/Math distribution courses.

SOCIAL SCIENCES

- Minimum 2.00 GPA required in each group.
- No Pass/Fail "S" grades allowed.
- Must include ECON& 201 and 202. Select at least one additional discipline (subject area) other than economics.

BUSINESS CORE

- All Business degrees must include the 25-credit Business Major core.
- No Pass/Fail "S" grades allowed in Business core.
- Minimum 2.0 GPA required for the category.
- Recommended grade for business courses is 2.0 ("C").
- Core courses are denoted with an asterisk (*).

ELECTIVES

- Consult with your academic advisor to carefully select an additional five credits from courses numbered 100 or above. See Specific University Requirements and Notes 1-6 on back.

BASIC DEGREE REQUIREMENTS: 90 UNITS

- 90 credits in courses numbered 100 or above.
- "D" grades may be used to satisfy requirements but a GPA of 2.0 must be achieved within each area. Note: See Business Core Recommendations on back.
- A cumulative college-level GPA of 2.0 is also required.
- A minimum of 30 credits must be earned at YVC.
- Students may graduate under the catalog in force at the time of entry for a period of not more than five years, if continuously enrolled.
- Application for this degree must be made by the student in the Registrar's Office.

HUMANITIES DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENT: 15 UNITS

Select from at least THREE different disciplines (subject areas). May include up to five credits of skill performance courses (underlined). May include up to five credits of a 100-level foreign language course OR five credits of a 100-level American Sign Language course. No more than 10 credits from any one discipline (subject area). Minimum 2.0 GPA required. See Note 3, below, for speech recommendation. ***This course has more than one distribution area; can be used only once on the application. Courses that are bold are acceptable for distribution but are no longer offered for instruction. The "&" sign denotes a common course among Washington State community colleges (see Catalog index for more details).

BUSINESS CORE (25 CR) + ELECTIVES (5 CR) = 30 CREDITS

Complete each of the 25 credit business core courses with a minimum grade of "C" (ACCT& 201, 202, 203, BA 256, BUS& 201) to be competitive in applying to four-year colleges and universities for junior status as a business major. Minimum 2.0 GPA required for the category. ELECTIVES: Select an additional five credits from courses numbered 100 or above. Note: Many universities and colleges have computer course requirements for admission to the business major. See your advisor and Note 6 below.

ADVISING NOTES AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- Completion of this degree does not guarantee admission to any baccalaureate university. However, with careful planning and depending on your intended major, it may be possible to fulfill admissions and major program requirements.
- This is a guideline to meet the degree requirements for students interested in transferring to a participating Washington State four-year college or university as a business major.
- This worksheet is only for advising purposes. Official approval of credits for degree completion is subject to the Yakima Valley College's Office of Registration and Records approval.
- Consult your business advisor on a regular basis for degree completion planning. Check with your intended transfer university/college advisor for specific admission and major requirements that can be fulfilled with this degree.

GRADUATION APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Students must apply for graduation. Submit your graduation application form two quarters prior to the expected graduation date and pay application fee.

SPECIFIC UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS - NOTES 1 to 6

1. To meet current EWU requirements, the second English Composition course must be equivalent to EWU's English 201-College Composition: Analysis, Research, and Documentation.
2. Students intending the international business major should consult their potential transfer institutions regarding the level of world languages required for admission to the major. Five (5) credits in world languages may apply to the Humanities requirement.
3. Students are encouraged to include a speech or oral communication course (not small group communication).
4. Students intending the manufacturing management major at WWU should consult WWU regarding the selection of natural science courses required for admission to the major.
5. International students who completed a business law degree course specific to their home country must take a business law course at a U.S. Institution in order to demonstrate proficiency in U.S. business law.
6. Five institutions have requirements for admission to the major that go beyond those specified above. Students can meet these requirements by careful selection of the elective University Course Equivalent to: WSU: Management Information Systems MIS 250; Gonzaga: Management Information Systems BMIS 235; PLU: Computer Applications CSCE 120, either an equivalent course or skills test; SPU: Spreadsheets BUS 1700, either an equivalent course or skills test; WWU: Introduction to Business Computer Systems MIS 220 (for transfer students entering fall 2014).
